




PROFILE



Setelah berdiri tiga puluh tahun, Galeri Mon Décor berkembang menjadi institusi seni yang disebut Art:1. Art:1 memiliki dua divisi utama, Art:1 New Museum dan Art Space:1. Didukung oleh konsep galeri dan museum, beragam pilihan karya seni dari seniman terpilih dapat dinikmati oleh pecinta seni. Kami memprioritaskan karya seni yang mengusung kreativitas, kematangan konsep, dan nilai seni yang tinggi.

Art:1 menawarkan berbagai program yang berubah secara berkala. Museum menampilkan koleksi permanen dengan proses seleksi yang ketat oleh kurator profesional. Sedangkan *art space* secara aktif menyelenggarakan program pameran yang memiliki fokus kepada para seniman muda terpilih.

Kami juga mengembangkan edukasi seni melalui penerbitan buku seni saat pameran tunggal. Selain itu, kami memiliki berbagai layanan untuk mendukung kebutuhan seni seperti: *commission work*, restorasi, konsultasi seni, penyewaan ruang pameran, manajemen pameran, dan pengiriman karya seni. Art:1 aktif dalam berbagai aktivitas senirupa baik lokal maupun internasional seperti Art Basel Hongkong, Art Stage Singapore, Art Central Hongkong, Korea International Art Fair, Art Moment dan Art Jakarta.







YAWARA OKY RAHMAWATI

Karya Yawara Oky Rahmawati bertemakan cerita tentang gambar anak dan ingatan manusia dewasa. Yawara menggunakan metode apropiasi untuk meminjam cara kerja serta visual gambar anak untuk dimaknai ulang dengan permasalahan hari ini. Seorang anak biasanya akan menggambar dengan polos tentang hal-hal bahagia yang pernah mereka lalui. Seperti momen ketika mereka diajak untuk bermain bersama di suatu tempat, bertemu dengan pengalaman baru, hingga khayalan-khayalan mereka yang naif.



OSAMU WATANABE

Osamu Watanabe was born in Yamaguchi Prefecture, Japan in He ia a contemporary art and was graduated from Tokyo Zokei University as a design major. He became popular with his art decorations of sweets, and he is the first person who made them as one ART form. He appeared in some Japanese TV shows such as "Tokyo Kawaii TV"(NHK) and "Tetsuko no heyaspecial"(Special program-Tetsuko's room).

He creates figures of candies, fruits and even whipped cream with his elaborate and colorful design. SUNGHOON KANG

Animals in Kang Sung-hoon's work appear free as the wind. They move, shaking off their weight and gravity, or scatter as elements of the wind. *Windymal*, compounding words 'windy' and 'animal', underscores the unified state of the two. In his work the combination is neither external or mechanical. As the artist suffers from excessive sweating, he always feels the wind as very fresh. This feeling is expressed through animal forms in his work. His sculpture is a visualization of wind blowing around an animal's muscles with the flow of metal strips.

Born in 1981, Kang lives and works in Seoul. He holds an MA from the Sungshin Women's University and was awarded the Grand Prize at 9th National Art College & Graduate School Sculpture Exhibition. Kang has exhibited at various locations such as Art Jakarta, booth Art:1 (2016), Seoul Arts Center, Seoul (2015); Korea University Museum, Seoul (2015); Leenpark Gallery, Paju, Korea (2015); Beyond Museum, Seoul(2014); E-Land Space, Seoul(2012); Space-K, Seoul (2011); Namsong Art Museum, Seoul (2010); Insa Art Center, Seoul (2010); Sungshin Women's University, Seoul (2009); Danwon Museum of Art, Ansan, Korea (2007); Lotte Gallery, Ilsan, Korea (2005); Art Center Mahno, Anseong, Korea (2004).







CHRIS SUHARSO

Chris Suharso was born in Solo, Central Java in 1931. He was introduced to the art world by his uncle, Siauw Tik Kwie. In 1964 Chris Suharso assisted the respected painter Lee Man Fong in painting the mural "Flora and Fauna of Indonesia" in Hotel Indonesia. Two of Chris Suharso's paintings are featured in the "Paintings and Statues from the Collection of President Sukarno of the Republic of Indonesia", a book authored by Lee Man Fong. One of his watercolor paintings "Study of a High Priestess" is displayed in Neka Art Museum in Ubud, Bali.

His first solo painting exhibition was held in Balai Budaya, Jakarta in 1965. The exhibition showcased his paintings of Balinese rituals and landscapes using impressionistic style. Over the course of the following years, he had held solo exhibitions in various art spaces in Jakarta: Balai Budaya, Taman Ismail Marzuki, Oet's Fine Art Gallery, and Mon Décor Gallery. His last few solo exhibitions in Mon Décor Gallery before his passing in 1999 were "The Pastel Touch" (1994), "Portfolio" (1995), and "Chocolate Party" (1996). In 2014, as a tribute of his work, a book featuring his works "The Tranquil World of Chris Suharso" was launched and an exhibition with the same title was held in Art:1, Jakarta.
